### **Approval of Proposed Agenda**

### **Review and Discussion of Proposed Legislation**

#### ***Early Prison Release for Certain Drug Offenders***

Pat Colloton asked for a technical correction in New Section 1 subsection (a)(1), where “The length of such probation or assignment **or** a community correctional services program shall be...” should be changed to “The length of such probation or assignment **to** a community correctional services program shall be...”

Secretary Zmuda and Chair Fowler requested two modifications in New Section 1:

(a)(3) – adding the phrase in bold, “Upon release, the district court in which the person was convicted shall have jurisdiction over the person **for all further proceedings.**”; and

(a)(4) – deleting the phrase “, and shall have the authority to initiate revocation of the person at any time for the reasons indicated in subsection (a)(3)”

Vice Chair Sexton moved to approve the bill with the discussed modifications. Jonathan Ogletree seconded the motion. Jessica Domme voted no. The motion carried and the modified bill was approved.

### **Agency Report**

Executive Director Scott Schultz informed the Commission about the recent activities of the staff, including updates on the progress of staff performance reviews, as well as the current progress of the Assessment Selection Committee and the SB 123 Committee and the progress of the budget appeal regarding the salary study raises.

### **Adjournment**

Jonathan Ogletree moved to adjourn. Representative Dennis Highberger seconded the motion. The motion carried.
